The cost is \$50 but that includes entry for two adults and the parking fee to park inside the gates next to the buildings (pre-73 cars only.)




There's plenty to see and do all day at the show!


This past month I sent an original equipment AM radio to a shop in Florida, who pulled the old guts out and put a state of the art AM/FM stereo module in it, and added RCA plug input jacks to allow the use of any iPod to input music into the radio.





