THE VON PIRANHA AMX

It took eight years but I finally found out what the heck these oddly customized AMX's were that I first saw in 2007 in Denver at the AMO National AMC Car Show.

Of over 200 beautiful cars there I remember one that stood out, an AMX that had odd scoops on the roof and side, with alterations to the "louver" section on the hood that was cut up.

I recall chatting with several people there while looking this odd car over, and just about everybody was saying, "What the bleep bleep is that all about?"

This week I saw a post on Facebook by Eddie Stakes about a "Piranha AMX" that was for sale in Colorado. I took a look at the eBay auction photos and I instantly recognized that car as the one I saw 8 years ago in Denver.

Curious I read on to learn more about the mystery car. The description on eBay said this..

The "Von Piranha AMX" was a limited-production (AMC Regional Special) custom commonly known as The Piranha AMX., sold out of the Denver, Colorado region in 1968-69. It is unknown how many total were modified.

They added the roof air scoops (nonfunctional) and side scoops that function to cool the rear brakes. The hood was modified as well. These cars were built for the drag strip and road course.

The red one below was raced by Ron Hunter at the Continental Divide Raceway near Pueblo, CO, and may have seen some duty at Pike's Peak although unknown.

This particular 68 Piranha AMX had a 390cid AMX V8 & Borg-Warner M12 Automatic along with Edelbrock R4B intake manifold and large


950 cfm Hollev 3-barrel carburetor. backed up with a 3:15 rear gear. There is a Bittersweet Orange 69 one known to still exist.




We are getting down to the end for sure. The paint date keeps slipping back but now I think we have a firm date set for the Saturday of Super Bowl weekend, one week from now.


