See you in three weeks!



Friday, April 9, was a great day to play hooky and take a day off from work for several members of SoCalAMX. The focus of our laziness—an annual AMC car show in the Phoenix area called the Cactus Classic, now in its 9th year of operation. The host of the show was the Cactus Cruisers, a chartered club of the American Motors Owners, a national AMC club. The Cruisers really put on a great show this year!



Last year I motored out to Phoenix by myself on a Friday afternoon, spent the night sleeping in my car in a parking lot, before getting up early and cleaning my car for the show. This year was a whole different story. Leading up to the weekend get-a-way a bunch of the SoCalAMX members let it be known on the Yahoo Groups that they were going to make the journey there along with me.



The people making it to the Cactus Classic this year were Dave & Kati Chick in their 68 AMX, John & Shelly Siciliano with their 69 AMX, Randy & Cindy Kirby in their 70 AMX, Bob Martinez in his 70 AMX, John Caley with his 68 AMX, Steve Fox in his 68 AMX, Stacy Thompson & Sheri in a 72 Ambassador Wagon, and myself in a 69 AMX.

The trip to Phoenix took two different convoys, Steve and Stacy heading out of the San Diego area eastbound taking the lower Arizona route, and the rest of us heading straight due east on I-10. To meet up together and form the I-10 convoy we all stopped in the City of Beaumont at Denny's Restaurant. That's where we got to meet newcomer Linda Sufficool and her green 1971 AMC Hornet for the first time. Linda is really excited about the big AMC show on May 22 and just had to stop by and see us and our cars, even though she had to pass on the trip to Phoenix.



Shortly after 9am we were back on the road, with our tummies full of eggs, pancakes and coffee. We set up a nice pace of around 68-70 miles per




hour (the years of the AMXs in the convoy) and pointed our cars in an easterly direction. Several hours later just past the CA-NV border we stopped at Quartzsite to refuel our tanks and tummies again. There was a food stand/trailer off to the side of the gas station where Brats and Burgers were washed down with soda. A Chihuahua dog, apparently belonging to the food stand owners, was all too willing to eat any scraps hitting the ground!

Another three hours of driving put us at the Embassy Suites around 4pm. For \$99 a night this was a great deal. Each suite was divided into two rooms, a bedroom and a family room, both with



flat screen TVs, and included was a microwave to heat food and a small refrigerator to keep drinks cold. Also included in the price was an all you can eat breakfast buffet and omelet bar. It turned out that there was a "Small Car" car show being held right there at the hotel the same weekend, parking on the grass areas all around our rooms.





After resting briefly, napping, and/or changing shirts, we formed up our AMC convoy again to head to a bar-b-q at Mark Fletcher's house (past president of the Cactus Cruiser's Club) to which everyone was invited. This bar-b-q was really out-



Also in attendance was Shirley Shahan, the first woman to win a NHRA national drag racing event. On a side note Mark Fletcher was trying to sell some of his AMC parts, possibly preparing for a move. I bought an instrument cluster I needed badly to replace mine, where the speedometer needle has fallen off, and also found a small gem in a dusty little box—a brand new NOS trunk light setup, including all hard-









ware, instructions, and a 40 year old light bulb. I wonder if it'll still light when I plug it in?




and taking tons of pictures. The men's group of the church put on a very good bar-b-q of brats, burgers and drinks, which satisfied growling tummies many times over.

I think the total number of cars at the show was in the high forties or so. With our eight cars from Southern California we were approximately 20%













