∨ega\$ Show Update


The big trip to the Vegas AMC Show is just a week from now—are you ready! Event Three:


One of our favorite shows to attend, the Route 66 Car Show in Santa Clarita was the finale for the day. For the first time since we've attended









ROAMPA RELIES 2009




rialize before us. The food attendants there sure work hard all morning and afternoon, not stopping


