

Playmate AMX Update

Not a lot visibly to show in pictures, but a lot of loose ends were cleaned up on the car the past few weeks. We were having a problem with the shifter console and the indicator lining up correctly. The transmission would be in park, but show on the console being in reverse. It was a simple fix.



We had the indicator plate in the console backwards. Okay now.

We were having a time setting the timing on the engine. Very erratic. Turns out the distributor bushings were worn out. I had a friend several years ago give me a bunch of parts from his AMX because of the engine swap he was doing.

Turns out one of the parts was a number matching distributor in good condition, so we're just going to swap some parts over from the old distributor to the new one, and put it in.

Stuffed the gas tank sending unit wire down from the trunk to below the car and hooked it up. The fuel sending unit in the dash is working fine now.

At this point the car is about 99% mechanically finished. Everything electrically is working, Turn signals, headlights, courtesy lights, dash lights, dash gauges. I mean everything, including the headlight warning buzzer, and even the light in the shifter console.

The newly rebuilt engine is running fine. Just needs a bit more tuning after we put the distributor back in.

The interior is finished except for the door panels to be put on. Glass needs to be adjusted some more. I was lucky to find a really nice used pair of door panels a few years ago, since there are no repos of a 68 panel. Both doors on the car had been replaced by the original owner, and the new doors had clear glass in them.

So I spent a ton of money trying to find replacement clear glass, when I should have been looking for tinted glass all along, since it is an AC car. Got lucky again, but had to pay a lot of cash, to secure a pair of pristine tinted windows with door tracks, for the PM AMX.

The last thing now to finish the car is to block sand and paint the car. The bumpers have been fitted already, so after the car is painted we'll just bolt the bumpers back up and be done. The window trim has been re-polished already. All the badging and emblems have been purchased.

The license plates were in real bad shape, they have been restored and are waiting to go back up on the car.

Here are the original plates, and then after being restored. Right after buying the car I took it to the 2010 AMC show in Las Vegas. My bad, one letter of the front plate fell off during the road trip, the restoration shop had to re-create the letter and graft it in place. That letter would be the "W."




2015 SOCALAMX CAR SHOW T-SHIRT DESIGN PREVIEW
